WBIA Member Named to Global Warming Taskforce

MILWAUKEE – Lynn Wilson, the Lake States Region General Manager for Plum Creek Timber Company, a member of the Wisconsin Bio Industry Alliance (WBIA), was named today to the newly-created Taskforce on Global Warming by Governor Doyle.
